

Summary:

Nick Bullock and Jon Bracey visited the Khumbu region of Nepal during October 2006 with the intention of attempting new routes on the North faces of Machermo (Phari lapcha) and Khonde.

After approaching Gokyo village two days were spent acclimatising before an attempt of the North face of Phari Lapcha West 5977m. Over the next two days the team climbed 'Snotties Gully' a sustained new route mainly on ice directly to the summit. Descent was made by abseiling down the line.

After a brief rest during which the weather deteriorated an inspection was made of the North face of Khonde. With poor ice conditions on the face the decision was made to end the expedition early and return to Kathmandu.

Expedition Diary:

- 3 Fly London Heathrow to Kathmandu
- 4 Arrive Kathmnadu 2pm
- 5 In Kathmandu organising Climbing Permit, food and supplies
- 6 Fly Kathmandu to Lukla. Walk to Jorsale
- 7 To Namche Bazaar
- 8 To Dole.
- 9 To Machermo village
- 10 To Gokyo village
- 11 Approach Phari Lapcha and stash gear at base of face
- 12 Acclimatisation to 5600m on hill called 'Frostbitten Fingers'
- 13 To base of intended route and bivouac
- 14 Start climbing at first light. Bivied on face.
- 15 Summit 12:40. Abseil down route and descend to Gokyo village
- 16 To Namche Bazaar
- 17 Rest in Namche Bazaar
- 18 Rest in Namche Bazaar
- 19 Walk to Thame to check conditions on the north face of Khonde
- 20 To Lukla
- 21 Fly to Kathmandu
- 22 In Kathmandu
- 23 In Kathmandu
- 24 Fly Kathmnadu to London Heathrow

Planning:

- Travel- flights to Kathmandu with Biman air. Booked directly with the Biman office in London
- Logistics- lobenexpeditions.com (We have both used Loben several times and I can whole heartedly recommend him)
- Accomadation- Thorong Peak guest house in Kathmandu. Tea lodges in the Khumbu.
- Visa- obtained on arrival in Kathmandu airport. \$30 / person
- Food and supplies- some specific items were bought in Kathmandu, but the majority of our food was bought in Namche Bazaar
- Permit- Loben arranged our climbing permit, and garbage deposit
- Gas- Loben supplied us with epigas cylinders (\$5 / 250g cylinder)
- Insurance- Snow card

Weather:

The weather during our expedition was in general fairly settled. Although we experienced several overcast days, with small amounts of rain/snow.

2 man bivi tent

2 x 60m, 8mm half ropes

DMM Rebel ice axes and gladiator crampons

7 ice screws

1 set wires

4 cams

3 pegs
